Volunteer Frequently Asked Questions



What does the work schedule look like for a typical volunteer day?

- The workday is approximately 9:00 am 3:00 pm.
 - Please plan on arriving to job site around 8:45 am



What should I wear?

- Dress appropriately for the weather and the work to be completed.
 - Closed-toe shoes only!
 - Clothes you don't mind getting dirty or messy



What do I do about lunch?

- Plan on packing a lunch, drinks (water) and/or snacks for the day.
- Some groups will make other arrangements for lunch, please discuss this with the Project Manager ahead of time.
- A typical lunch is 30 minutes.



Does Servants provide the tools I need?

- Servants provides the tools and materials needed to complete the work.
 - Volunteers are encouraged to bring their tools if they have them.
 - The project and work description should give an idea of what tools to bring, or the volunteer can reach out to their Project Manager.



What items should I consider bringing?

- It all depends on the type of job but here are some items to consider:
 - Hat, Gloves, Sunscreen, Knee pads, Bug spray, Sunglasses, Extra water.









Volunteer Frequently Asked Questions



Are their group size limits, age limits, or skill requirements?

- The ideal group size is 7-12 individuals. If you have more, we can accommodate that, but we'll typically split the build into multiple groups to better suit the job size. This allows each person to stay busy and engaged all day.
- All ages are welcome if the team arranges for appropriate adult supervision.
 - If a youth team is serving, we ask that there be one adult leader for every five students. Children under 12 may serve but must be accompanied by a parent.
- We really mean it when we say that our group volunteers don't need to have any previous building experience! We'll work with you to find a project that meets your group's skill level.



What can I expect?

- We are a relationally focused ministry. So, we pray that you take the time to connect and talk to the homeowner you are serving as it will be a blessing to you.
- We also want you to connect and grow with your fellow volunteers as you serve Christ together.
- We know the work will get done, but the chance to connect and build relationships may not happen again.
